## YOUR PROACTIVE DEMOCRATIC SELECTMAN

Hal has been a Middlebury resident for 43 years. He was one of the first elected Police Commissioners. He was a commissioner from January 1973 to October 1986, and served several years as the chairman.

He has been a Justice of the Peace for many years. He also served on the Beautification Committee; the Greater Waterbury T.V. Council; the Equity Analysis Committee; the Local Emergency Planning Committee; Chairman of Boy Scout Troop 6 with the late Ed Phillips, Scoutmaster; the town's Selective Service Coordinator; formerly served as district coordinator for Congressmen Bill Ratchford and Jim Maloney. Also, he was Gloria Schaffer's coordinator during her race for the U.S. Senate. Hal belongs to the Middlebury Historical Society, and the Middlebury Land Trust. He is retired from the Knights of Columbus and Kiwanis International. Hal was instrumental with the Republicans in commencing in Annual Town Food Drive. He also started a Remember the Troops Day, and he began the late-PFC Anthony D'Agostino Scholarship Fund Raiser. Hal was involved in having Two Jima Veterans participate in several Memorial Day Parades.

He has voiced residents' concerns about the Towantic Generator Plant poised on Middlebury's border with Oxford. Also, he has been involved in the Federal/State 1-84 road need studies for Southbury, Middlebury and Waterbury.

Hal has been a Selectman since 1999. He spends a lot of time attending, on most occasions, monthly meetings of Town Boards and Commissions, and numerous Region 15 Board of Education meetings. Hal advocates fiscal restraint while supporting a quality education for the students.

Hal is a veteran of the Army Air Force during W. W. II and Korea. He joined the Air Force when he was 17. He was a reserve Air Force officer for 15 years.

He retired from Uniroyal Chemical after 30 years. He held positions in Labor Relations, Licensing and Acquisitions, and Director of Purchasing for the Chemical Division worldwide. His annual budget was multi-millions of dollars. Following his retirement from Uniroyal, he was employed as a negotiator/mediator in the Labor Relations Division of the CT. Department of Labor. He currently serves as a state management arbitrator.

### PROGRAMS FOR 2007/2009

Hal has been and will continue seeking adoption of the following programs:  
He would add more Democrats to various Town Commissions. He has already sought and has gained seats on the Board of Finance; the Aging Commission; the Police Commission; Safety and Health Commission the Economic and Industrial Development Commission and, the Planning and Zoning Commission.

He will continue the pursuit of the 7.2 m overpayment owed to Middlebury by Southbury.

Also, he'll continue trying to create a Region 15 Financial Control Board to contain the school system's expenditures, hopefully eliminating the waste of taxpayer dollars.

During his next term, he will seek an additional \$1,000 annual tax relief for all seniors over age 65. He was successful in getting an ordinance passed lowering taxes for veterans with limited earnings. He will also, seek affordable housing for senior citizens.

He will promote the orderly development of more commercial and fewer residential areas in Middlebury while maintaining the natural character of the town.

Hal will continue involvement in the development of the town's new parks; the water line extensions and the extension of sewer lines as well as fire hydrants.

He advocates the purchase of additional open space for the town's land inventory. He also, advocates a program to study and limit the number of excessive and useless signs in town.

He will continue being available to all Middlebury residents to answer their questions about municipal problems.

Hal enjoys the challenges of being a Selectman. He communicates easily with town citizens and, seeks the support and votes of all Democrats, Republicans, and Independents.
